

From Your Pastor's Heart

I truly "thank my God upon every remembrance of you" (Philippians. 1:3).

CUSSING CHRISTIANS? Cursing is the opposite of using our words to bless others and it seems, according to some surveys, that swearing and using foul or obscene language is more accepted than ever. There is a growing debate as to whether cussing is appropriate for believers. Now more pastors use profane language in the pulpit to "better connect with the culture"—or so they say. They claim vulgar language makes them more relevant and that this is absolutely essential if we want to reach certain segments of our culture.

But what does God say? Well, in Colossians 4:6, we are told, "Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one." Paul is speaking here of general conversation and he tells us that a believer's speech should be like Christ's (Luke 4:22). To speak with grace means to say what is spiritual, wholesome, fitting, kind, sensitive, complimentary, gentle, truthful, loving and thoughtful.

The Christian who uses foul language in public wastes the opportunity to set himself apart from many unbelievers who commonly say the same things. The fact is, the person who doesn't know you but hears you fire off a cuss-word in a sentence would not likely think what a fine Christian man (or woman) you are. Your speech gives him no reason to think that you are any different than everyone else and that gives him no reason to listen to what you might have to say about Christ.

As followers of Christ we are not to offend anyone unnecessarily, not even the unbelievers around us, and certainly not a fellow Christian. Cussing is not part of the gospel message, and it certainly is not an essential Christian practice. So, if even a single Christian (or an unbeliever, for that matter) is offended by your foul language, you have sinned.

Many movies receive a certain rating because of foul language. Even unbelievers recognize that cussing is inappropriate. It's sad and shameful when Christians claim they are free to cuss when even our sinful society recognizes it as offensive. Our highest aim is to glorify God in all that we do and say and to "let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth" (Eph. 4:29). Proverbs tells us "death and life are in the power of the tongue". Here's a thought: use your words to thank God and thank others. That will help you and encourage others, and it's always better than cussing!
