

From Your Pastor's Heart

We are so blessed to have such a caring and giving church family!

REVIVAL—For several months now we have been meeting each week to pray for revival to come to St. Clair Southern. Can there be any doubt that we need it? As more and more Christians realize, truly "revival or ruin" is what we face. With that in mind, I plan to share some thoughts about it in this column for the next few months. I have asked Bro. Jeremy Hostettler from Hermitage First Baptist Church to come and preach God's Word to us this fall as we seek the Lord in revival and spiritual awakening. But, please know that revival does not come just because we have scheduled time for it on the church calendar or just because we have invited a preacher to come and speak. No, revival comes when we seek the Lord for it and when He graciously gives it to His church.

How do we know that we need it? Well, for one thing it seems to me that Christianity doesn't mean very much to a lot of people who call themselves Christians. Why is it that Christianity seems to mean so little to so many?

Christians believe that they have been delivered from God's just punishment for their sins because Christ endured their hell when He died on the cross. There is nothing we can do to earn our salvation, but there are many things we can do to show our gratitude for salvation such as reading and studying God's Word, praying, regularly worshipping Him, giving generously to the Lord's work or showing love and appreciation to others. These and other things that God requires of us would seem to be the very least Christians can do to show their love and gratitude to God for saving them from hell. You would think every Christian would gladly do all that God asks and then ask, "What more can I do?" After all, being rescued from hell is no small thing!

And yet, as shocking as it sounds, there are many people who claim to be Christians who find these things to be too much for them. They never read their Bibles, pray or

attend church services. They give little or nothing to the Lord's work. They say they are saved, but they feel no gratitude to God. Church leaders find themselves faced with this question: **Why does Christianity seem to mean so little** to people who claim to be Christians?

One answer is that it's possible for true Christians to allow themselves to get into such a cold and backslidden condition that, for a while, they do not live as they should. But the more likely answer is that many of these people are simply not Christians at all! They think they are, but they are not! They may have walked down an aisle at church, got baptized or have their name on the church's membership list. But becoming a Christian means having your life changed. If there is no change, there is no Christianity! It's as simple and as frightening as that!

The sad truth is many people expect their so-called Christianity to get them to heaven, and yet it won't even get them to church! How horrible, sad and painful it will be when these folks hear those terrible words from Jesus: "I never knew you; depart from Me. . ." (Matthew 7:23).


